Cat Mask

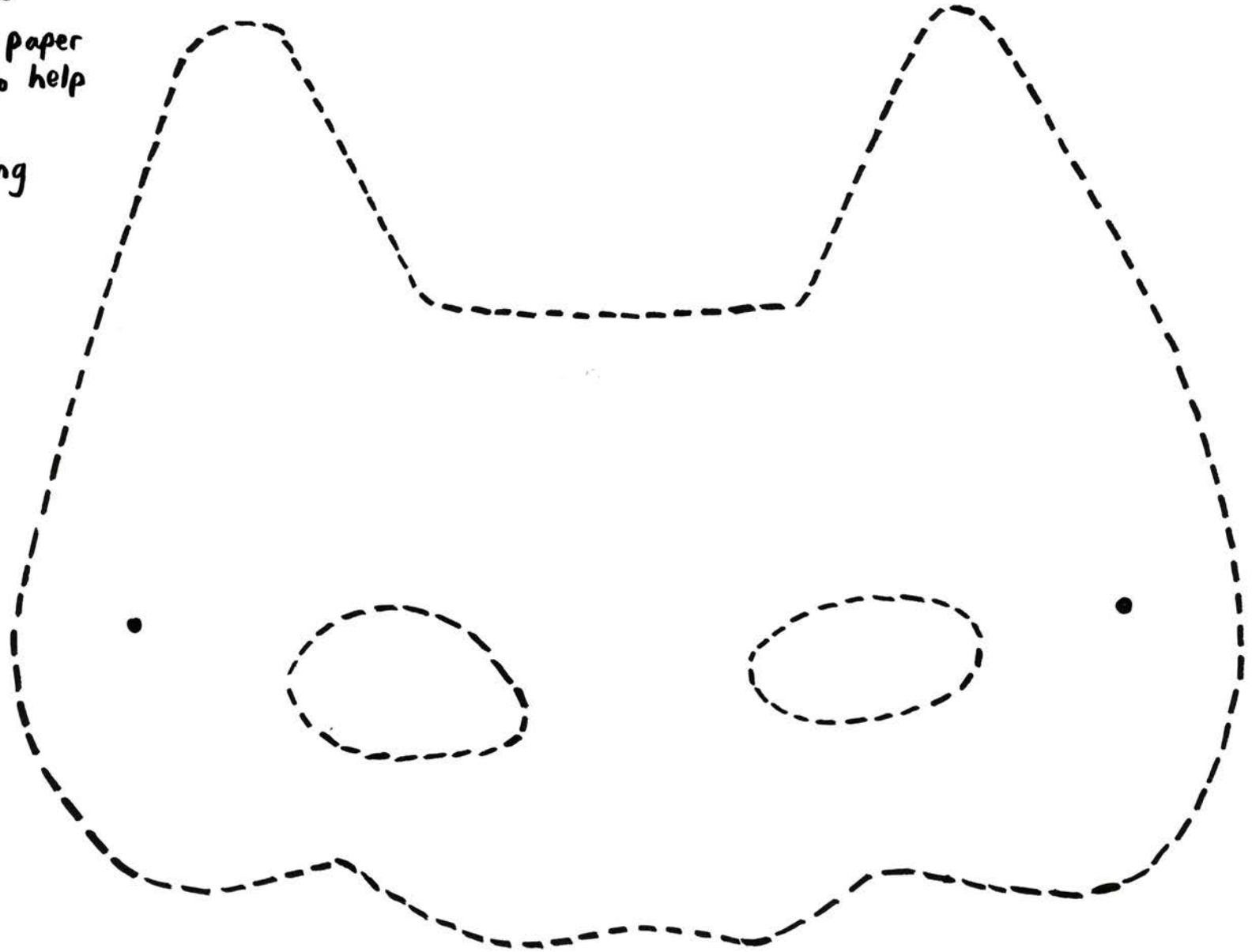
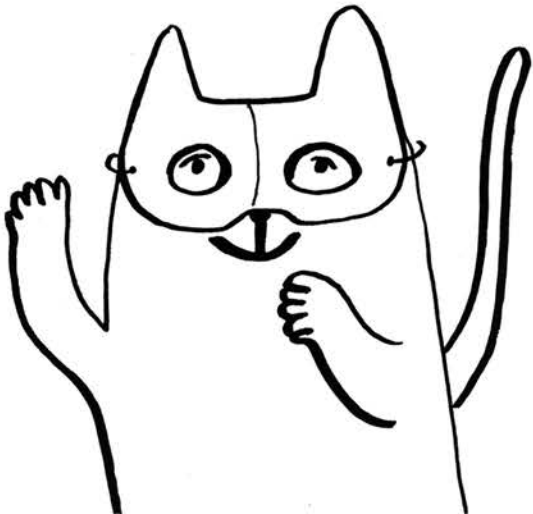
You will need:

- orange and red tissue paper or colouring pencils/pens
- Glue stick if using tissue paper
- Scissors and a grown up to help cut it out.
- A piece of elastic or string
- A needle

1. Print this template onto white card if possible. Ask an adult to cut out the mask and eye holes and use a needle to make the holes for the elastic/string either side of the mask.

2. Tear up tissue paper into small pieces and glue onto the mask to cover all the white area, avoiding the eye and string holes. If you don't have any tissue paper use colouring pencils/pens.

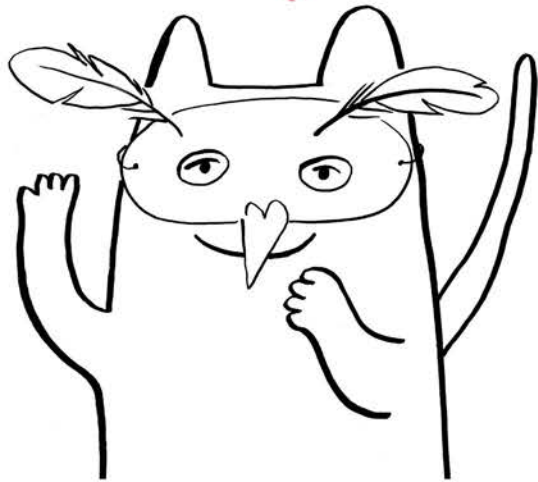
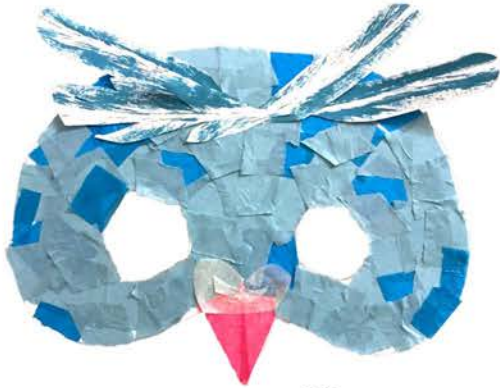
3. Once its all covered, thread the piece of elastic/string through one of the holes, make a little knot to secure it. Try on the mask and allow enough elastic/string for it to sit comfortably, then secure the elastic/string through the other hole. Now you can be a cat whenever you like!



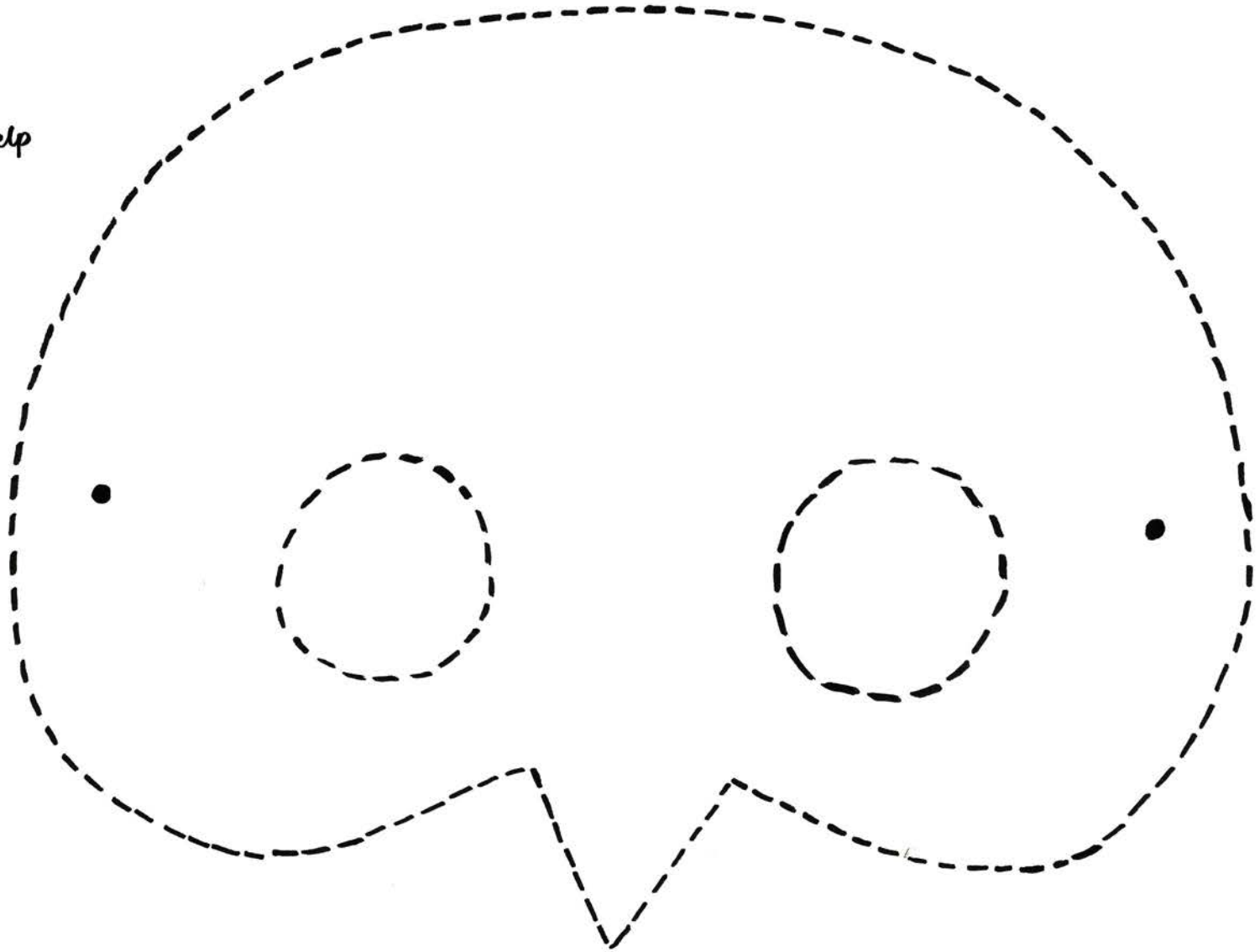
Pigeon Mask

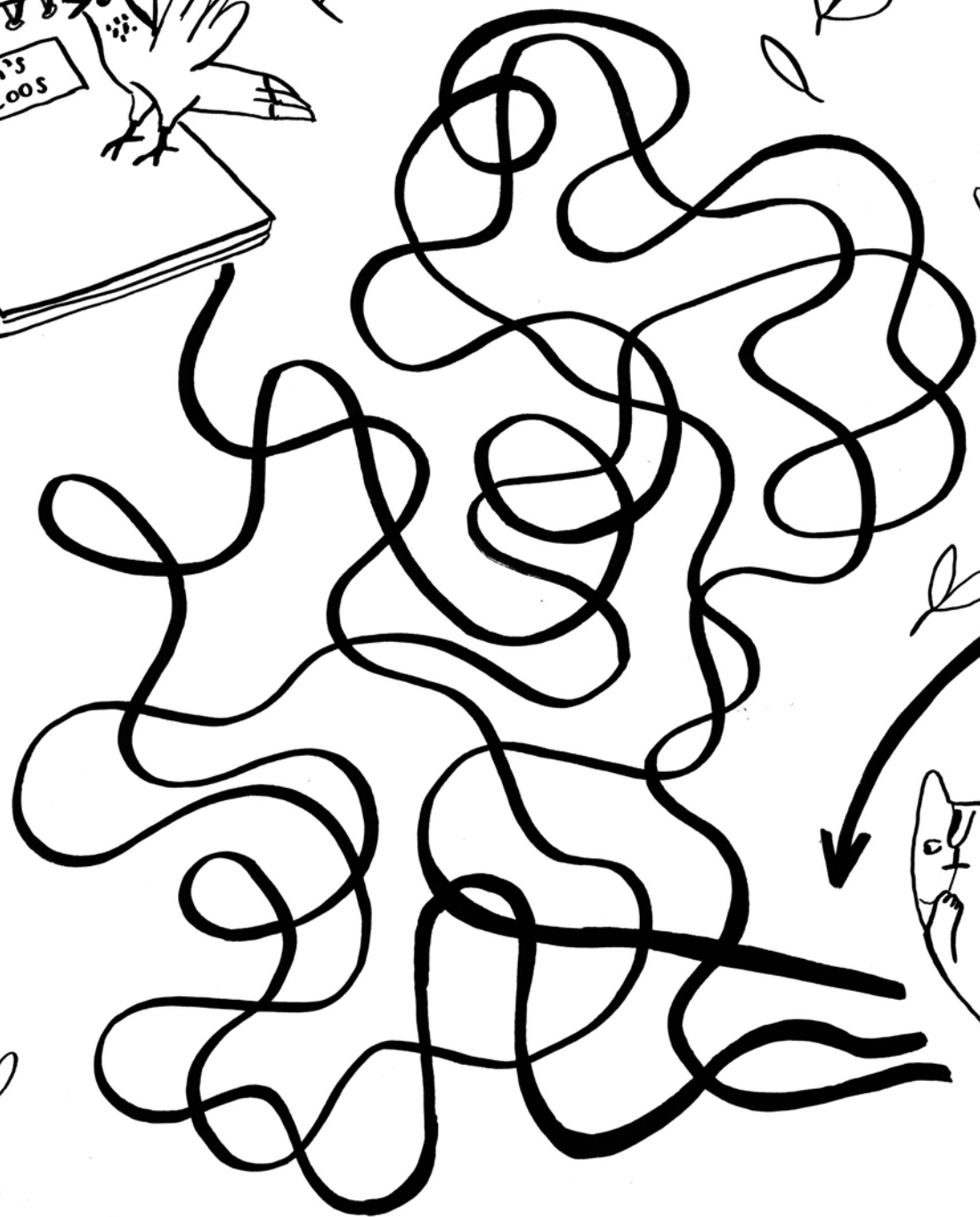
You Will need:

- Blue/grey/white tissue paper and Pink/orange tissue paper for the beak or Colouring pencils or pens
- Glue stick if using tissue paper
- A piece of elastic or string
- Scissors and a grown up to help cut it out.
- A needle



1. Print this template onto white card if possible. Ask an adult to cut out the mask and eye holes and use a needle to make the holes for the elastic/string either side of the mask.
2. Tear up tissue paper into small pieces and glue onto the mask to cover all the white area, avoiding the eye and string holes. If you don't have any tissue paper use colouring pencils/pens. You could draw some feathers to stick on too.
3. Once its all covered, thread the piece of elastic/string through one of the holes, make a little knot to secure it. Try on the mask and allow enough elastic/string for it to sit comfortably, then secure the elastic/string through the other hole. Now you can be a pigeon whenever you like!





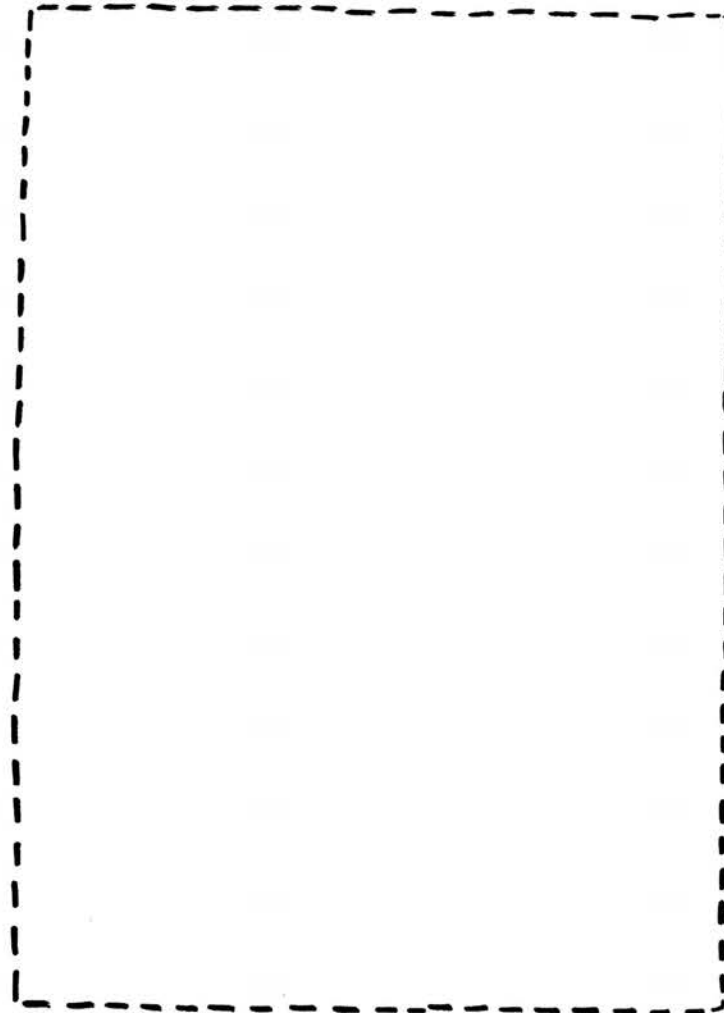
Make your own poster or Protest Sign

Using words and pictures is a great way of letting others know what you care about and giving a voice to animals, nature or people. Maybe you care about the environment and would like to encourage others to think about being kinder to nature. Here's an example I made because I love bees!

You Will need:

- lollipop stick
- scissors
- colouring pens / pencils
- sticky tape

In Keith Among the Pigeons, Keith uses words and pictures to show how he feels about the rights of birds in the garden.



1. Draw and colour in your design in the box area.
 2. Cut it out (or ask an adult to help)
 3. Tape a lollipop stick to the back with a bit sticking out.
 4. Hold up your sign with pride, or you could pop it in your window.

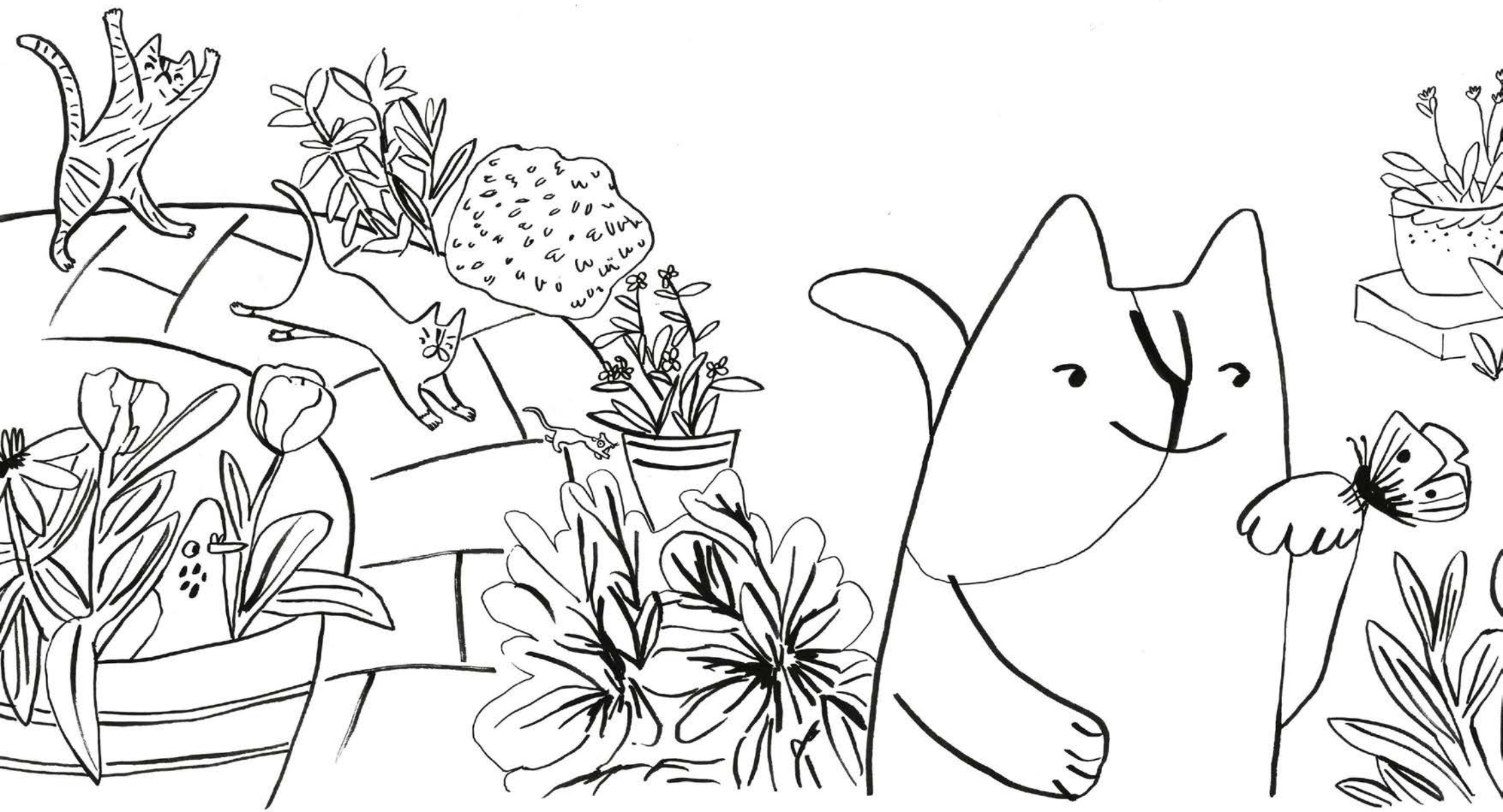
